**Clubhouse News**—The pool closed September 10 and a new pool cover was installed. It replaced the pool cover provided when the pool was built in 1999.



Over the summer, cracks and flaking paint were noticed in the clubhouse ceilings. A lengthy investigation found that the problem was caused by aging insulation around the ceiling air conditioning vents pulling away from the metal allowing condensation to form. The insulation problem has been repaired and preparations are underway to select a contractor to repair and paint the affected ceiling areas.

Eddybrook replaced the plants around the Dominion Club monuments on the corners of Dean Farm and replaced the ornamental grasses on the south pool fence.

## New Ohio Drivers License Requirements

If your Ohio drivers license will expire soon, be prepared for a change in the process for renewal that requires documentation.

Your current unexpired drivers license is valid for US airline access until October 2020. At that time you would need the new “Real ID” Ohio drivers license for airline access. A valid unexpired passport will get you airline access at any time, now and after October 2020.

The new requirements came from a recommendation of the federal 9/11 Commission that the federal government set minimum security standards for how states issue identification and for how that identification is used. It was a response to stopping terrorists from entering the country and to stop the production of fake IDs. The Real ID Act was passed by Congress in 2005.

Currently, all 50 states are either compliant or have extensions, meaning none of these residents need alternative identification. There are 28 states that are now Real ID compliant, including Texas, Ohio, Florida, Nevada and Colorado, while 26 states and territories have been granted extensions.

As of Oct. 1, 2020, the T.S.A. will ask all travelers to have a Real ID-compliant driver’s license or alternate acceptable identification to fly domestically. You can still use your current unexpired Ohio drivers license until that date.

Travelers won’t be able to pass through security without this acceptable identification.

In Ohio, it’s best to get the new “Real ID” license when you renew it before October 2020. Renewing an expired license or getting one for the first time requires much more additional documentation..

The basic rule is to prove your identity. To prove identity, you must show proof of the following 5 elements:

1. Full legal name
2. Date of birth
3. Legal presence in the U.S.
4. Social Security Number
5. Ohio street address

Items 1, 2, and 3 can be proved by a U.S. birth certificate, U.S. passport, or US passport card.

Item 4 can be proved by a Social Security card, W-2 Wage/Tax form, or 1099 Income Statement.

Items 5 can be proved by a long list of documents including bank statements, utility bills, that show your name and address.

Additional documents may be required if you changed your name by court order, marriage, or divorce.

New Ohio drivers licenses are sent to you by US mail, they are no longer issued to you directly by the local office.
